Also, **AAA** now offers a **motorcycle towing option** to their well-known roadside assistance
program. This is the program that helped Heather
get her bike into service for the new tire... when
dad Jim Barclay pulled out his AAA/Motorcycle card.

Is it strange that I want to ride to Success, Missouri, for no other reason than to say that I've made it?

[Then there are those places] with no apparent merit whatsoever: Dull (Ohio), Boring (Oregon), Normal (Illinois), Nothing and Why (both in Arizona) and Why Not (North Carolina).

Our weekday impromptu rides continue to be popular with 6 to 10 members (and sometimes Red Knights from other chapters, as well!)




A stop at "The Wall That Heals" (A replica of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial) during its visit to Townsend in June.

#### What is a GRAND TOUR?

Even though the Grand Tour program has been around since the beginning of the Red Knights, some newer members may not know the details of the challenge. Below is taken from the Red Knight International's webpage.

When the club was young, the easiest way to tell others about it was by word of mouth. This meant that the members had to get out to visit other firefighters, and one of the best ways to do that was to visit Fire Stations.

The idea grew into a program of rewarding members who made a certain number of visits with a certificate and a pin. Proof of these visits was needed and so the idea of Grand Tour was born. After visiting Fire Stations (and taking photos that needed to be developed and mailed into the RKMC) beginning with the letters G R A N D T O U R members were given a pin.

Over the years, other rides were added, RED KNIGHT and FIRE HOUSE rides and for members from remote areas, a ride to visit TWELVE STATIONS beginning with any letter of the alphabet. For those who want the ultimate, you can choose the ALPHABET tour which includes all the letters in the alphabet. WOW!

The challenge now offers a three inch patch, instead of a pin, with a rocker for each of the rides.

# Congratulations to Mass-2's first GRAND TOUR MASTER — Rick Oliver!

Rick Oliver is the first member of Mass-2 to complete all five RKMC Grand Tour Challenges and receive his Grand Tour Master coin as recognition from the RK International.

To receive this recognition, a member must complete the five challenges by visiting 65 individual fire stations, take a photo of the rider, bike and station and spell out (1) Grand Tour, (2) Fire House, (3) Red Knight, (4) 26 letters of the alphabet, and (5) 12 additional stations. Rick did all five challenges during 2021 which meant that no station could be repeated in the five challenges to meet the master challenge. (The RKMC allows the Master challenge to go beyond one specific year, but the individual challenges must be completed within a riding season).

This year's quest for Rick began with a spring motorcycle trip to Tennessee with Bob Laford — and Rick realizing they would be traveling near a station that began with the letter "Z." With the Z in hand, the rest should be easy!

The 65 station journey came to an end recently with another road trip with Bob, this time into Ohio to find the final entry — X!

Rick actually completed two complete alphabet Grand Tours this year without repeating a single station, so that means 91 individual fire station visits for our Vice-president in 2021!



Now with digital photos making submission of proof easier, a database is kept to track who has completed the rides. When you have completed your visits simply fill out the application form and return it with your pictures to the Grand Tour Chairperson and he/she will send you your certificate and patch and rocker

Photo albums (physical and electronic) are kept displaying pictures of everyone who has completed the Grand Tour.

#### **Mass Fall State Meeting**

It was a great day for an ourdoor state meeting in New Salem. 43 Red Knights from around the state converged on Rick and Lori's house for the fall meeting.

They were greeted with really big (and tasty) donuts from Market Basket, and left after their fill of hot dogs, burgers, and a lot of food (including Mary Barclay's Apple Crisp) that was really good! Thank you to all that helped out... and the 20 MA-2 people that were on hand.

#### **International Happenings and Information**

Because the 2021 Convention fell victim, for another year, to the pandemic and the closed border with Canada, the International had to hold their annual board meeting virtually, and much of the business with member participation, like Bylaw votes, had to be postponed until 2022.

The annual (virtual) business meeting was held on Saturday, August 21. Reports from the E-board members are available on-line.

Treasurer Scott Ryan reported that many expected expenses for the club were down, given the continuing restrictions. One "up" is the participation in the RKMC Grand Tour, as that can be done singularly or in small groups, Scott reported. The mortgage balance on the Boylston property is about \$230,000. Financial details are also available on the International's webpage.

#### Future conventions have been decided by member input:

- 2024 to be hosted by Germany 18
- 2025 to be hosted by the Illinois State Association
- 2026 to be hosted by Australia 5

Region 1 and Region 7 had contested elections. Eric Jock (NY50) was elected in Region 1 (and we thank Matt Mattera for his years of service and friendship), and Tom Van De Kley was elected in Europe, as Pierre Halleux did not run for re-election.

Running unopposed were President Joey Powell (NC 12), Treasurer Scott Ryan (PEI), and Regional Directors for Region 3 & 5.

**The 2022 Convention** is being hosted by PA22 in Johnstown, PA. That chapter presented a report including basic information about multiple hotels with 500 rooms available and shuttle services to the host hotel when the host hotel is full.

Johnstown is a walkable community, and there will also be shuttles to the arena where the Saturday banquet will be held. (The movie Slapshot was filmed in this arena and there is a display about the movie).

Four separate rides will be scheduled to the Flight 93 Memorial in nearby Shanksville, PA. An "early bird" ride for those showing up prior to Thursday will also offer stops at the Shanksville FD, the first responding FD to the 9-11 crash and to the Flight 93 Memorial Chapel.

Separate rides will be offered to the (1) Quecreek Mine rescue site, when nine miners were trapped underground for over 77 hours, from July 24 to 28, 2002. All nine miners were rescued; and (2) to the Johnstown Flood site, where over 2,200 people died when the Southfork Dam failed, flooding the valley downstream. This was the largest civilian loss of life disaster in the U.S. prior to 9-11.

Staples of the convention including Hospitality Room, Welcome BBQ, and Farewell Breakfast are also part of the itinerary.

The 2023 convention is in Solomons Island Maryland.

In a column in the recent issue of Rider magazine, Trevor Denis talked about his "Motorcycle Obsession."

He was on his way to look at an older used bike and his neighbor remarked that, "Didn't he just buy a new bike?" His response was tongue-in-cheek, "I have a problem."

But on his way to see the bike he started to wonder — Do I have a problem? He said he uses a simple formula to decide if he needs to procure another motorcycle, and that formula is X + 1 (where X is the number of motorcycles currently in his garage).

He went on to talk about how motorcycles and the activities associated with riding, wrenching, togetherness, solo rides, rides with his kids, rides with his wife two-up, etc. helps his mental health, as "Life always seems better during and after a motorcycle ride."

He looked back at the last year-and-a-half and how the pandemic and the societal lockdown effected he and his family and how motorcycles helped them endure the circumstances — together.

All those aspects of having a bike in the garage, that we may take for granted planning rides, riding together, wrenching and even those solo rides — all contributed to his family coming out of the pandemic closer.

His final paragraph said it the best.

Motorcycles have helped my family and me stay sane during this once-ina-lifetime (hopefully) pandemic, providing an outlet for seeing the positive side of life. No my obsession with motorcycles isn't a problem. It's

#### the solution.

Look back over the past 18 months of your life and focus in on your bike, riding, and the Red Knights. Have those components helped with a bit of stress relief and helped you (and yours) keep your sanity in the crazy environment?

We'll still be here in 2022. Come join us for some stress relief — and some comic relief. Your Red Knights family is ready to help be part of your solution!

**ANNUAL MEETING** — Massachusetts Chapter 2's annual business meeting was held on Saturday, October 30 (under a rainy sky) in the community center of Millers Woods, in Athol. Thank you to Charlie Hamberg for making arrangements for us to use the facility.

Planning is underway to expand memorial plaque options, as current space is soon exhausted. There is still interest in having a "buy-a-brick fund-raiser to build a walk between the memorial and the house, and that drive will becoming in the future.

There may be a need for a Red Knight spring clean up around the property in Boylston. Stay tuned for any updates about these situations.





