Elsewhere in this newsletter you will be able to review the miles that our members put on their bikes... as we get closer to that collective two-million mile mark!

Overall last year we averaged 13.36 people per event for our 14 held events. With the pandemic effecting all levels of Red Knight events, our chapter was also limited in gathering and events. Normally we are close to 40 different events, and some with more than 40 people in attendance!

Prior to the onslaught of COVID's full force, we did have 22 people at our Winter gathering at the Glen Caffe and 18 members at our bowling afternoon.

Our big events like our Christmas party and Americade were not even a possibility. But we did gather for a number of small rides once the restrictions were lessened in the summer.

Let's continue with that tradition of spinning our wheels together as we look forward. We are planning picnic rides and those with quick stops to get some grab-and-go meals to support local mom -n-pop businesses.

At the end of 2021, when we look back on this year's ride statistics, I suspect COVID will be a rear-view memory and we will all be hugging each other at the 2021 Christmas party!

2020 Chapter Mileage

We have been keeping track of Chapter Member mileage for 13 years now, and our total of documented miles for those dozen years is 1,891,515 with the addition of this year's 114,489 miles.

Last year was 148,281 miles and over 13 years, our yearly average has been just over 145,000 miles. Even with the pandemic, and our group rides were limited, our chapter members did respectable mileage. It looks like 2021 we should break the 2 million mile mark!

Thank you to our new VP, Rick Oliver for taking on the mileage count and for outgoing VP Maury Lizotte for keeping track of the figures for many years.



2021 RKMC International Convention

August 18-22 is this year's convention being hosted by New Brunswick-1, across the border to our north. With fingers crossed, pandemic restrictions around our country (the border crossing) and around the world, we hope to see a group of chapter members heading off to Saint John in Canada for the International Convention.

For those of us who remain within the states, we will have our own "International Ride" on Saturday, August 21, with our travelers on our mind!

If you are interested in planning for the convention, you can get all the details, and register on-line at www.rkmci2021.com. Accommodation arrangements have been made with Delta Hotels by Marriott Saint John for the Red Knights.

At the annual business meeting, one piece of business taking place at the 2021 convention, will be votes for hosting the 2024, 2025, and 2026 conventions. Because of last year's convention cancellation, no decision was made on 2024 or 2025. (2022 is in Pennsylvania and 2023 is in Maryland).

Other events in the planning are a 12-Station ride, Moosehead Brewery Tour (with a bus for the tour), a Five Ferry Ride along the Kennebecasis River, St. John River and the Belleisle Bay, St. John River Cruise, and several other guided ride options. (*Some of these events are extra costs and require pre-registration*).

> There is also a First Responder's Memorial Service to commemorate our fallen heroes and recognize their many contributions. It will also celebrate all first responders who work & volunteer to protect us on a daily basis.

Other convention staples including Meet-and-Greets, Vendor's, "Ask the Board" meeting, banquet, and farewell breakfast will also be on the schedule.

Please let President Martin know if you plan on attending the convention this year.

The International Motorcycle Show has been re-tooled for 2021 to become **IMS Outdoors**.

In past years one of the shows during the winter months was at the Javits Center in NYC.

This year organizers have taken the opportunity to completely reimagine its offerings, taking the consumer show formerly hosted inside conventions centers and moving it to outdoor venues. IMS Outdoors organizers hope to create a festival-like atmosphere to create a more immersive experience for attendees.

The outdoor venues will help the shows proceed amidst any COVID restrictions, and the dates named are to capitalize on warm-weather months for the shows.
