From the President,

During the year I like to step back and look at what we have done as a club and where we are going as a club. As we grow we have to make adjustments and changes to keep up with the growth, so this is a never ending battle, more commonly known as work in progress. I am glad we made the move to include Regional Directors into our structure of the International Executive Board. As you know we have four Regions now and a need to have a fifth. The biggest reason is because out West the Western Director has a difficult time servicing the entire Region, especially the southern part. His area covers part of Canada and all of the Western United States as far South as New Mexico. The Director lives in Canada. The land miles he has to cover in his Region makes it difficult for one person to handle. We need additional help to service this large area. This is something we will have to talk about at convention.

We have two Regions hosting a rally each year. The Regional rallies I have attended are very much like a mini International Convention. It would be nice if we had all four (and soon five) of the Regions host a rally. It is sometimes easier for members to attend a Regional Rally because of the distance you have to travel. If you don't have Regional Rallies and you start talking about one I'm sure your Regional Director could possibly organize one within a reasonable length of time. This is a good way to get together and talk about the Red Knights with other chapters. A lot of good ideas have come out of Regional meetings.

Of course the Convention is where we finalize everything we talk about all year. The attendance of the Chapter President or his/her representative from your chapter is important. If a representative is attending the convention your chapter dues must be up to date and you have to have a letter from the President stating you are the chapter representative. As it stands now the International Executive Board has long term goals and short goals that you need to hear about. I know the members must have some goals they would like to talk about at convention also.

I thank the Executive Board members for all their help this past year. The past six months has been challenging to say the least. Some chapters require more guidance than others. It takes more time than you would believe to run the International. All of the board members are very dedicated to their jobs and put in a lot of time every month.

I am running for President again this year. I have made some personal adjustments so nothing should interfere with the time needed to do my job as President. I have learned a lot since I was elected in 2007. I have enjoyed working with the Executive Board and youthe members. I feel I still have some good ideas for the Red Knights Club. 2008 Year End Report from the International Treasurer

Listed is my year-end report for January 1 2008 till December 31st 2008

As International treasurer I submitted to the board a quarterly report for all quarters of the 2008-year including an end of year report. I also provided the board with up to date financial records and a report for all three Executive meetings held in 2008. In January of 2009 I mailed to the International Secretary a CD with a copy of all the Treasurers records as stored on the treasurers Lap Top Computer along with paper copies of my year end reports.

I made hotel arrangements for all Executive board meetings held during the year as well as arrangements for air flights for those members required to fly in to attend.

Meetings where held: April 4, 5, 6th 2008 in Syracuse New York
August 20, 22, 23rd 2008 in Sandusky, Ohio
October 23, 24, 25th 2008 in Syracuse New York

Set up and maintained a tracking databases for funds donated by the chapters for the Red Knight Memorial. All promotional and events grants given to the Chapters and Associations of the Red Knights Organization along with all grant funding provided to the Chapters and Associations for multi-chapter events for the Red Knights Membership.

Maintained and tracked the Organizations investment account and made reports to the Executive board on a quarterly base the state of that account.

On July 15th we completed the trade marking process for the name "Red Knights and RKMC then on November the 4th we completed the trademark for Red Knights International Firefighters Motorcycle Club we are now just waiting for the completion of the same trade mark applications in Canada which should be completed early in 2009.

We also changed legal firms in 2008 as the lawyer who has handled our trade mark application since the beginning of the application process in 2004 Joseph Englander left the firm of Christopher & Weisberg P.A. and became a partner in the firm of Shutts & Bowen

We now own the names and logo design (which is the crest on the back of our vests):

Red Knights International Firefighters Motorcycle Club
Red Knights
RKMC

We currently own the Canadian rights to the logo and name Red Knights and are awaiting the finalization of the application process for the remaining names as owned in the United States.

On January 18, 2008 I filled with the IRS the required 1096 form dealing with our 1099 Misc. form reporting honorariums paid and interest earned on our investment account then on February 1, 2008 I filed the Red Knights corporate tax return with the I.R.S

On August 28th 2008 I filed the annual report with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in regards to our articles of incorporation.

Unfortunately because of the personal commitments of our quartermaster he was unable to keep up with the demands of the quartermaster's office and stepped down. The Board in turn appointed Kent Armstrong as Quartermaster and Joy Ellis as his assistant. There have been several procedural changes made that have greatly sped up the time requirements for the chapters to receive the orders they have placed.

With the appointment of a new Quartermaster the International treasurer took over the complete control of all monies and accounts for that office, which did increase the amount of work required by the treasurer but made the system and accountability of the cash receivables and liabilities considerably more accurate.

Spent 1679 hours (35 hours per week) during the period of Jan 1 – Dec 31 2008 dealing with Emails, phone calls, and correspondence related to the duties of International treasurer with approximately 2 hours per week spent on Internationals Banking requirements. Averaging out to 34.98 hours per week an increase of 4 hours per week from 2007 and 14 hours per week from 2005

The above mentioned times are also above the time required to attend Executive meetings and the business conducted at the Internationals business meeting held each August. I also attended two funerals in 2008 for Red Knights members that had passed away as the representative of the International Board.

At this time I would like very much to thank all the members of the International Executive for all the help and encouragement they have provided me in a very hard and trying year.

I would also like to extend a warm welcome to the new members of the executive board for all their efforts on behalf of the membership and the team building that has continued over the past couple of years to bring the board to the level it is now at, without that drive and devotion the organization would not be able to survive.

At the completion of my fifth term (10 years) I would also like to at this time to state my intention to run for one more term of office as International treasurer and am requesting the support of the chapters and membership for my candidacy in the elections to be held at the 2009 convention in Fort Lauderdale Florida in August.

Red Knights International Firefighters Memorial Site Report for 2008

As most members are aware we dedicated our Memorial Site in Boylston Massachusetts in August of 2007 this was a very proud moment for our organization in that we were able to dedicate this site to those that were members of the Red Knights when they passed away.

This site was built as a result of the vision and hard work put forth by the members of the Massachusetts chapter 1 with the support of the general membership and chapters.

Three members of the Red Knights that have gone beyond the norm in volunteering time and Labor to this cause and need to be recognized by the membership for their hard work and dedication to the memorial site are Don Parker, Peter Coskie and Roger Wentzell

The total cost for this project was \$128,152.94 this was done through donations of services and goods from various companies and members along with donations of \$22,141.85 from members and chapters. The International also advanced as an interest free loan the amount of \$23,108.00 to be paid back by continuous fund raising from the chapters. The balance still outstanding in balance of that loan is \$15,641.00 so we still have a long way to go to retire the loan amount.

On top of the loan repayment we need to have a funding project to ensure the continuous care and maintenance of the site. The International Quartermaster has for sale a Red Knights memorial patch which can be viewed on our web site in the quartermaster catalog all profits from the sale of this patch goes to the maintenance account for the memorial site.

For the 2008 year we had set aside in the maintenance fund \$627.00 from the 2007 convention 50-50 draw as well as the \$725.00 raised by the raffling off at the 2007 convention of the beautiful hook rug made by Peggy Brouillet and her mother.

That \$1,352.00 along with \$6,500.00 that was put forth by the International allowed us to take care of this year's upkeep and the erection of an addition name plaque for the members that had passed on since the 2007 convention.

We currently have 121 members who have passed on and whose name is currently inscribed on the memorial plaques. This will be an ongoing process where every spring we will update the plaques with the names of those members that have passed on since the previous spring update.



To date this year we have only raised \$155.00 from the 2008 Convention 50-50 draw and \$690.00 from the sale of Heavens one-memorial patches for a total of \$2,860.62 a far cry from what is required to maintain the site.



So once again I am asking the chapters to make a donation to the Memorial. Below is a list of those chapters and individuals that have made pass donations, as you will note there are several that have made the donation to the site any annual gift. The recommended amount is a donation of \$100.00 for every member from the chapter that is on the memorial list, but again that is just a suggestion the chapters will have to decide what they can afford to donate some will be able to afford more and others less. All donations will help to keep this site as something we are all proud of and a show of respect for those of our members that are no longer with us.

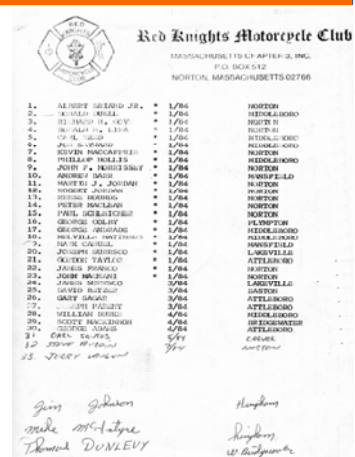
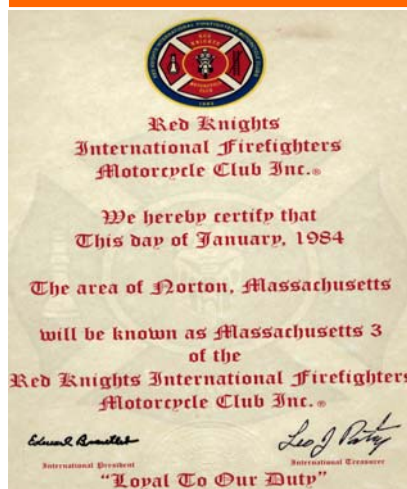

I'm Dale Smith, NC State President and the President of NC Chapter VIII.

In September of 2005, my wife was diagnosed with Cancerous Cells in her Cervix. In October she had her first surgery. We were reassured by her Doctor that the surgery will take care of all the cancer. Well that was not to be and she was diagnosed with Stage One Cervical Cancer. In November 2005, my wife had her second surgery. We spent Thanksgiving Day of 2005 in the hospital, but it was all worth it when the doctor came in and said those magic words, "We removed all the Cancer".

In March 2006, we started the Red Knights Chapter in our city. We began volunteering at the UNC Burn Camp for kids 6-16 yrs. old and have begun working with kids 0-6 yrs old. 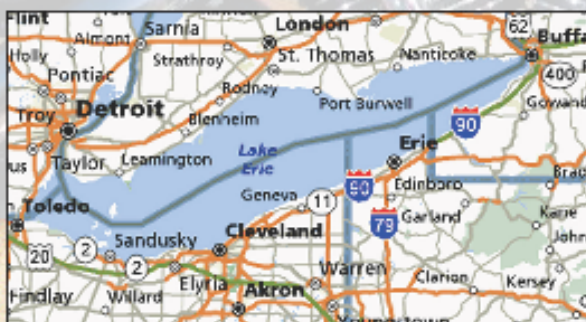
