Some guys I know were out touring in the mountains where they happened across a fellow I'll call Bill S. He seemed like a likable chap, so they invited him to join their ride.

Well, it came to pass that Bill, while an amiable fellow, wasn't much of a rider. Assembled at the hospital an hour later, the group members agreed that they really should notify Bill's family... but of course they didn't know a thing about this man who was already under anesthesia. Then one of them struck upon an idea that must have seemed brilliant at the moment.

"Let's check his cell phone!"

"Nancy" was the name at the top of the speed dial list – Bill's wife probably, or maybe his sister. A man's voice answered. No, Nancy wasn't home. Who wanted to know? I never claimed to be an expert on the subject of group riding, but I would say one of the first rules would be make sure that your girlfriend's husband is *not* your emergency contact!

The moral of the story is to let us know who to call ahead of time! Please use the enclosed form to help provide us with information in case an emergency arises while you are with the club and some sort of assistance is needed or we need to contact family for you. Each of the officers carries a database of this information. Many people have already sent in their information over the past few years. We've enclosed a form for those of you who have not yet submitted one, and also in case information needs to be updated for those who have already filled out an emergency form.
