2021 Ride Statistics

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will be able to review the miles that our members put on their bikes... and in 2022 we start to keep track of the next million miles because in 2021 we passed the 2,000,000 mile mark, since starting to keep track 14 years ago!

Overall last year we averaged 13.38 people per event for our 26 held events. Our average is almost exactly the same as last year, but fortunately, we nearly doubled the events for 2021 compared to 2020. Normally we are close to 40 different events, and some with more than 40 people in attendance!

Hopefully the trend will continue — COVID will lessen, and our ride schedule will grow!

Our big events in 2021 were our July 4 and Labor Day cookouts with 31 and 26 people, respectively, and our Christmas party had 36 people. Although our mid-week hooky rides are a lot of fun, they are usually about a handful of riders. If we take them out of the statistics, our attendance for the other rides in 2021 actually jumped to an average of 16.6.

Let's look forward to 2022 with a hopeful gaze that we will be gathering together to roll on some miles and have more smiles join us!




Red Knight Help-a-Knight. Have you ever been traveling and thought, "GEE I DON'T KNOW ANYONE AROUND HERE?" "Where is the best place to eat, stay, or get my bike worked on?"

That's what the Help-A-Knight program is for — to maintain a database of Red Knights who are willing to accept telephone calls and help fellow Red Knights. Some of the help may be for information, or other options you may find help with would be if a Red Knight member can stay overnight, pitch a tent in a yard, or leave a bike at a fellow Red Knight's house.

The Red Knights Help-a-Knight Directory is available as a *downloadable file* on the International's Webpage. It is a great resource to keep on your bike for when you are traveling. (Even if you are traveling by four wheels). It is always fun to meet up with other Red Knights, but even more beneficial if getting together with them helps with any problems that you experience when on the road!

If you already list yourself as a resource for others on the HAK, you may want to check your information to make sure its current. Not listed on the directory? Consider listing yourself as a resource to travelers to our area and you make meet more of our RKMC family.

Didja-know...

President William Howard Taft, a Republican who served as the 27th President of the U.S. AND later as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, is the only sitting president to attend a motorcycle



On July 4, 1911, President Taft attended a motorcycle race at the Indy Mile (in Indianapolis). The big race of the day was the "President's Race," a match between Erwin (Cannonball) Baker on an Indian and John Sink on a Merkel. Along with the President, 25,000 others attended the race in the 103 degree heat — the second hottest day on record for Indiana's capital city.

Baker took the race, but both he and Sink battled throughout the five-miles to the finish line. Both riders were summoned to the president's box after the race, where the President remarked, "I congratulate you Mr. Baker, I have never seen such a race before. I don't know if you hold your breath when you go around those corners, but I do!"






