At the annual business meeting for our chapter, scheduled for October, the officer positions of Vice-President, Treasurer and Road Captain will be up for election/re-election.





Unfortunately, Thursday's rain held on until just about noontime, making the turn out for the open house and ride rather slim. About 50 people stopped in the station and 10-12 bikes went on the ride. Once back from the ride, the members of NY12 had dinner ready for everyone.

Over \$11,000 was raised by riders on Saturday in the Americade Ride for Kids. Those dollars go towards research and support for Pediatric Brain Tumors.

**Rally**, held in Plattsburgh, NY was a recordbreaker with 361 Red Knight in attendance. NY 43 was the top chapter with 32 members in attendance. NY50 did a great job and had us all entertained throughout the stay.

We had a pizza night together one evening, a collection of food trucks were waiting for us another night — and that evening had an ice cream social as well as a live band. The "banquet" was a BBQ with pulled pork and BBQ chicken (and all the fixings) that was just fantastic!

We had Red Knights from all over the world. Our friends Rolf and Monika from Switzerland were on hand, as were Red Knights from Italy. A number of friends from across the Canadian border joined us as well. As you can expect, our Swiss 1 friends were the "furthest traveled." Norm Beausoleil was furthest via bike with over 1,700 miles from Florida and Mike Woods from Indiana pulled in

second on his bike with just under 1,000 miles. Both the candidates for International Secretary were on hand, Colin Nelson from NH-9 and Mike "Woody" Woods. And they were both very gracious and socialized with each other — as they should!

The Region 1 coins were on hand to be sold, raising funds for the new "Mayday Fund" to help Red Knights in need. Coin number 343 was auctioned off and brought in a \$1,010 telephone bid from NJ State Rep Ken May. The rally's charity was the Tunnels to Towers Foundation. The hosts held a cash drawing for \$500 and our friend Rolf won it — and donated his winnings to be placed against the principle of the memorial house's mortgage. There were also 50/50 drawings each day and a rally 50/50 drawing that had the winner receiving over \$700.

On Saturday, over 180 bikes participated in a police escorted and blocked ride to the Lake Placid area and back to a local fire station for a cookout. We seldom get that far north to ride, but even venturing out with a bike or two, the roads and the vistas were great!

In this edition of our newsletter we thank Charlie Clarkson (our first State Representative and Road Captain) for sharing two-wheeled memories with us.

As a young man, I always wanted to ride motorcycles, but family life and household finances delayed that until I was a bit older.

Nearly 40 years ago, Phil Jordan sent out fliers to area fire departments looking for firefighters who ride and would we be interested in starting up a chapter of the Red Knights. Phil had scheduled a meeting for those who were interested, and since I had recently purchased a Suzuki 400 (and gotten my endorsement) my late wife Joyce and I were 100% for joining this new club!

Wives were welcome as social members of the Red Knights and both Joyce and the other wives felt part of this "start up" organization so we could all ride together. Joyce and I put on over 150,000 miles

together riding our motorcycles — and enjoyed every mile of it!

The club was starting to grow, both as a chapter and beyond our local circle of riding friends. I was elected chapter Road Captain, a position that I held for 16 years — FOLLOW ME! After about a year, the position of State Representative was discussed and I threw my hat into the discussion and was voted in as the first Massachusetts State Rep. 




Perfect May weather greeted us for a Hooky Ride... with ice cream at UConn.








### Dear IMS Fans,

The powersports industry is at a crossroads with where and how brands promote their products amidst the continued manufacturing and sourcing delays associated with the pandemic. These current hurdles that our brand partners are facing would have made it difficult for us to produce an IMS that would meet your, and our, expectations. Therefore, we will not be moving forward with the planned 2022 events, including the Ultimate Builder Custom Bike Show.

After the event completed, we had a ride for our members and had ten bikes take a good country ride through Royalston and Fitzwilliam to cool off a bit.


A huge success and thanks to all who participated!
